
CLASS 1 NEWS

Stations of the Cross


Class 5 visited church and led the stations of the cross with Fr Phillip. They were very respectful and considered the footsteps of Jesus.




Arts and Crafts

EAT TO DEFEAT THEM!



Some of the lunch-time table tennis club competed against other schools in a pairs competition. An enjoyable opportunity to play against other children. Another enjoyable participative opportunity occurred when a group of year 3 children took part in a multi-skills event during the school day at West Craven Sports Centre.

The boys football team have played fantastically. They worked together as a team, winning two out of their four games. We are very proud of them all and praise was given to our coach for being a lovely gentleman!
